Jernej Letnar Černič is an Assistant Professor of Human Rights Law at the Graduate School of Government and European Studies in Kranj (Slovenia), where he serves as a Vice-Dean.

He graduated from University of Ljubljana with the France Prešeren award. He also holds Diploma in Human Rights Law from the European University Institute and Diplome de droit international et de Droit compare des Droits de l'Homme (merit) from René Cassin Institut International des droits de l'homme. He completed his Ph.D. in Human Rights Law in 2009 at the University of Aberdeen. Jernej also serves on the management board of the European Union Fundamental Rights Agency.
