Since January 2013, Ms. Elena CIMA has been a Research Fellow at University Institute of European Studies – IUSE, Turin (Italy).

She is also PhD Candidate in International Law at The Graduate Institute of International and Development Studies – IHEID, Geneva (Switzerland), Research Associate at gLAWcal – Global Law Initiatives for Sustainable Development (United Kingdom).

She obtained her LL.M. (2014) at Yale Law School (USA) and beneficiary of a prestigious grant award of the Bank of Italy.
